IEB Matric results A TESTIMONY

of the efficacy of online learning and Brainline's Top Performers continue to shine

Brainline says it is encouraged by the number of excellent performers who have emerged amongst the 2021 Matric Results. The Independent Examination Board (IEB) will release the matric results today, Wednesday 19 January 2022, while the Department of Basic Education will release their results on Friday, 21 January. The IEB has recorded a 98.39% pass rate, up from 98.07% in 2020. Brainline is IEB recognised.

Brainline CEO, Coleen Cronje says despite another challenging year amid the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, a number of students showed their steel during the final exams. She says Brainline students achieved 178 distinctions overall. There were 310 B's and 385 C's. This is a testament to the courage and tenacity of the Class of 2021.

'We are extremely proud of all our Grade 12 learners who have had to deal with unprecedented circumstances over the last 2 years. We would, however, like to highlight the performance of a number of our students who managed to achieve exceptional results. While the majority have been home schoolers for a number of years, some only joined our online school from 2020, when their own schools closed during the country-wide school lockdown. As a virtual school, we were able to provide these learners with a safe and uninterrupted alternative and our results speak for itself,' Cronje explains.

Cronje says one of Brainline's learners managed to score within the Top 5% of the overall IEB results.

'Megan Joynt really did us proud by not only scoring within the Top 5% of the IEB, but she is also among the Top 1% in 5 of her subjects. Megan achieved 7 distinctions for Afrikaans First Additional Language, Business Studies, English Home Language, History, Life Orientation,

Mathematics and Tourism. Another learner who achieved 7 distinctions is Alexander Russel for Afrikaans Home Language, Business Studies, Computer Applications Technology, Engineering Graphics and Design, English First Additional Language, Life Orientation and Mathematical Literacy,' Cronje says.

Brainline students were among the 12 000 IEB students who completed the 2021 matric exams. Cronje says the consistent performance by these learners is a testimony to the efficacy of online learning amid a very challenging academic year. Cronje says now is the opportune time for basic education authorities to look at restructuring the current traditional school system by phasing in e-learning elements.

South Africans are familiar with a more traditional classroom set-up but now is the time to evolve. E-learning and mobile learning should be viewed as a stand-alone or additional learning resource that can assist in accessing learning tools. Last year during his state of the nation address, President Cyril Ramaphosa said that the government wanted to provide learners with a tablet to access e-learning platforms. He also indicated that the government was working with network operators to reduce the cost of data. This drive should be on government's radar more than ever before.

How to cope with POOR MATRIC RESULTS?

It's almost time for the Class of 2021 to receive their matric results and Brainline believes it's important that learners take time to prepare themselves emotionally and psychologically for whatever the outcome may be.

The Independent Examination Board (IEB) will release its results on 19 January 2022, while the Department of Basic Education will release their results a day later on 20 January 2022. Brainline Mentor, Liezel Bruwer, says while the majority of learners will use the holidays to relax, the possible stress and worries about final reports may linger.

'It has been a very difficult year for the Class of 2021, having had to once again cope with a radically different environment due to Covid-19. It is, therefore, important to take this into account but also to remember that the results don't define you as a person and that everyone has a different set of skills, knowledge and attributes,' Bruwer says.



Bruwer says parents or guardians can also have an effect on how students experience the waiting time and receiving results. She has given a few tips on how to support these learners during this period:

- Check the expectations set for your children and ensure that these expectations are realistic.
- Continuously reassure your children that you believe in them and that you will be there for them no matter what.
- ✓ Do not compare results between siblings or with any other students. Compare their current performance with their past performance.

She also has tips for the students:

- ✓ Replace self-criticism with self-correction learn from your mistakes
- ✓ Talk to someone if you are upset or unhappy with your marks.
- ✓ Remember, exams are not the end of the world
- ✓ Don't compare your results with friends

Learners who do not achieve their expected results, Bruwer says, may experience disappointment and stress ahead. She says it is important to discuss various options with your family and teachers and to put things in perspective.

The most important thing is not to panic. If your restults are lower than expected, work through your options with your parents and mentor. Contact your tertiary institution and discuss your marks with them, if you fear that it might have an influence on the entrance requirements,' Bruwer explains.

Bruwer says there are also other options available besides asking for a remark.

'If you were registered for the October/November 2021 exams and completed the Oral, PAT,



Practical and SBA components, you are eligible to register directly with the IEB to write the May 2022 exams. Students who deferred some subjects to May and learners who want to improve their marks may do so. There is no restriction on the number of subjects you may register for.'

Bruwer says another alternative is to repeat Grade 12 to improve all the subject marks.

In the bigger picture, this might be a good alternative for certain learners who did not fare well due to various circumstances and poor results might influence their future plans. It is, however, important not to make any rash decisions. Don't rush, take your time, weigh your options, don't be influenced by friends or news headlines and make the right decision for your future.






Computer Applications Technology


